Here at EPI we are wishing one of our team members good luck as he starts a new chapter in his life.

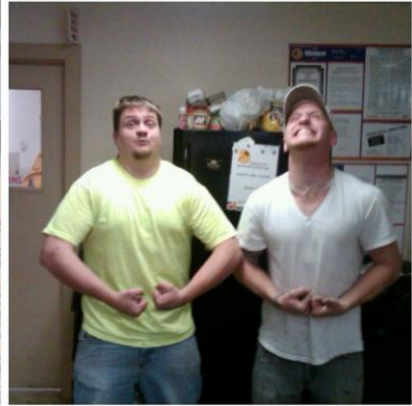
